Dear Pres. Kennedy,

I am writing this letter to voice my protest against the invasion of Civil Liberties, which took place in Toledo, Ohio. When a horde of Federal men invade a private institution -- conduct themselves in the manner in which they did. I was of the opinion that men that worked for the Federal Government would be well versed in an individuals rights under the Constitution.

They had the audacity to attempt to search a building without a search warrant. They also held a 61 year old man at gun point and terrorized a 19 year old girl who happened to be a secretary.

I have always been very proud to be born in the United States. We have our Constitution to protect our rights. I don't want to believe that you have knowledge of this disgraceful affair as I have been and still am a staunch supporter of you and your administration.

I am talking about the way that F. B. I. men came into the Union Retiree Center and behaved. They were certainly no credit to you.

Mr. Gosser has appeared before every kind of an investigating committee and has never reverted to the 5th amendment. They have never proved any thing on him and I think it is time that he quit being persecuted.

I resent the treatment he is receiving, but that is not the text of this letter.

We are in the United States, not a foreign country. Please do not allow our liberties to be violated. Lets keep United States a free country. We love it that way.

I would very much like to know the individual or individuals responsible for this outrage.



Division and Mr. Stated he was thoroughly familiar with the raid described by but that it was conducted by IRS. Agents rather than FBI Agents and that there is no basis for the allegations that the Agents conducted themselves improperly. He also advised that Gosser is presently under Federal indictment in connection with the investigation conducted by IRS. Mr. further advised that the Department has received information indicating that approximately 100 officers of various union locals attended a meeting in Ohio at which it was discussed that letters of the type written by the prepared and sent to President Kennedy and the Department. Mr. Similar communications and expects to receive more.

Mr. requested, and Mr. concurred, that no action concerning the alleged civil rights violation be taken by the FBI at this time in view of the fact that Gosser is under indictment and the civil rights complaint was not forwarded by him. Accordingly, no investigation will be conducted unless specifically requested by the Department.

OBSERVATIONS:

Since has alleged improper action on the part of FBI Agents, it is felt she should be written and set straight on this matter. Since her letter apparently was instigated at the direction of UAW officials in Ohio, however, it is not deemed advisable to advise her in any way concerning the civil rights aspects of this situation or the Department's decision.

On 1/30/63, an anonymous telephone call was received at Toledo, Ohio Resident Agency of the FBI. Caller stated that one (phonetic) described by caller as "close to officials of Local 12, UAW", had stated that someone had made contacts to insure that there would be a hung jury in the GOSSER trial. · RICHARD T. GOSSER, V-P, UAW, DONALD L. PINCIOTTI, GOSSER's administrative assistant, and TED MAISON, all Toledo, presently on trial USDC, Toledo, on charge on Conspiracy to Defraud U.S. Government, in that they obtained confidential documents, reports, and records from Intelligence Division of IRS, Toledo, in violation of Section 371, Title 18, U.S. Code. Review of Toledo Directories and credit and criminal checks failed to reflect any residing in Toledo Area. Information concerning telephone call furnished to AUSA, and subsequently, at his request, to IRS, Toledo. On 2/2/63,

Parkway, Toledo, Ohio, Local 12, UAW, advised he had made statements to numerous people stating he believed the GOSSER case would result in a hung jury, basing such belief upon his own opinion formed by reading newspaper accounts of the case.

It is to be noted that the Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service (IRS), Toledo, Ohio, during the latter part of 1962, conducted extensive investigation of RICHARD T. GOSSER, Vice-President, United Auto Workers (UAW), DONALD L. PINCIOTTI, GOSSER's Administrative Assistant, and TED MAISON, a reported numbers racket figure, all of Toledo, Ohio.

As a result of the above investigation, these three persons were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Toledo, on November 28, 1962, which charged them with Conspiracy to Defraud the U.S. Government in that they obtained confidential documents, reports, and records from the Intelligence Division of IRS, Toledo, in violation of Section 371, Title 18, U.S. Code.



RCCHARD T. GOSSER of Toledo, Ohio, and Hollywood, Fla., was convicted on a plea of not guilty on 2/28/63 at Toledo, Ohio, for violation of Title 18, USC, Sec. 371, arising out of an Internal Revenue matter. Applicant's appeal was denied on 10/11/65 and he commenced a 3-year sentence on 11/23/65 and was paroled 11/23/66 and his parole expired on 11/22/68. Applicant submitted petition for pardon on 1/11/69, advising his reason was that a sickness from which he was suffering is terminal and he wants a pardon. Applicant interviewed and background information obtained and set out.

DETAILS:

This investigation was predicated upon receipt of a letter from T. OSCAR SMITH, Pardon Attorney, dated February 20, 1969, which enclosed a petition for pardon dated January 11, 1969, for RICHARD T. GOSSER. GOSSER stated in his petition that he was sentenced on February 28, 1963, to three years imprisonment in the Northern District of Ohio at Toledo, Ohio, after pleading not guilty to a conspiracy to defraud the United States in violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 371, arising from an Internal Revenue matter. His appeal was denied on October 11, 1965, and he commenced serving a three-year sentence

on November 23, 1965, in the United States Penitentiary at Terre Haute, Indiana. He was released on parole November 23, 1966, and his parole expired November 22, 1968. Applicant advised that he has no subsequent arrests since his release from parole but stated he had previously been sentenced at the age of 20 to the Michigan Reformatory for robbery and was paroled December 7, 1923, after 2½ years. He was arrested on November 19, 1939, as a deserderly person and paid costs and on July 26, 1949, for reckless driving, paid \$5 and costs, and on August 18, 1920, he paid costs as a suspicious person. He stated that he was retired as the international vice-president of the United Auto Workers and that he has served as a consultant for the Toledo Health and Retiree Center in Toledo and is still so employed. He stated he desired his pardon because he is suffering from a deteriorating physical condition which is terminal. Applicant attached character affidavits from

Toledo, Ohio, from Avenue, Toledo, and from Mr. Road, Maumee, Ohio.

Applicant's wife was contacted at her residence in Hollywood, Florida, on March 11, 1969, but the applicant was in a weak condition and could not be interviewed. He was interviewed on April 3, 1969, and volunteered the following information:

He stated that since his release, he has been employed as consultant by the Toledo Health and Retiree Center, Toledo, Ohio. He stated he receives \$25,000 a year in this capacity. He stated he has had no other employment since his release. Applicant stated he spends the winter months at 408 Lawn Acres Court, Hollywood, Florida, and the summer months at his permanent residence, 311 West Woodruff Avenue, Toledo, Ohio.

Applicant stated that he entered a guilty plea at the time of his arrest as he did not believe he was morally guilty of the charges against him but that quite possibly he may have been technically guilty and he did not wish to involve a lot of other people. He stated it concerned an income tax matter and that in the civil action, he was reimbursed by the Government. He stated

he desired a pardon, not for any business reason but because he believes he is suffering from a terminal illness and he wants to die with a clear name. Applicant advised that he makes \$25,000 a year in salary and he has income from other investments, Applicant stated that because of his illness, he is confined to his home except for automobile rides, in which his wife drives the car, and that he does not have any outside interests. He stated he conducts his business by correspondence and by personal contacts of interested parties. He said his only associates would be Father JAMES GROGAN of Heather Downs Boulevard, Toledo, Ohio, and Msgr. MEROME SCHMIT, head of the CYO in Toledo, Ohio. Applicant stated that he has no matters pending with any federal or state government. He stated he has had no arrests since the one for which he is applying for pardon.



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

Source acquainted firsthand with many Toledo area politicians and indicated leaders of this area which included GOSSER had conferences deciding at that time that GOSSER would make concerted effort to win church leaders and organized labor support in any way possible. Father JAMES BROGAN, St. Patrick's Catholic Church, 4201 Heatherdowns Boulevard, advised on May 2, 1969, he had known RICHARD GOSSER intimately for the past eleven years. He said he became well acquainted with GOSSER after his appointment by the Bishop of the Church to chaplain for Local 12, United Auto Workers. He said that in this capacity he counseled officers and members of the union. He stated this was in addition to his usual parish duties. He added that GOSSER was instrumental in the organization of a summer childrens camp which is open to children of union members and to poor children in the area, with preference being given to children of union members.

Father BROGAN added that GOSSER was also instrumental in forming the Labor Management Committee in Toledo for the purpose of cementing relations between management and labor and which offers its services to Toledo industry and because of its effectiveness, the committee has gained a wide-spread reputation. He said GOSSER was instrumental in the founding of the Toledo Health and Retiree Center which is open to all retirees and families of union members. He said it services and benefits these people by offering craftwork to retirees and medication and pharmaceutical supplies to members as well as dental work, all at reduced prices. He advised the funds to operate the Center came from union assessments.

He added that GOSSER was extremely active in civic affairs and has been active since his release from federal prison. He said that he did not believe GOSSER was guilty of the crime for which he was convicted and was convicted because of his attitude when he took the stand as a witness in his own behalf. He noted GOSSER tended to be "iron fisted", rough and would use profanity and this hurt him in his trial. He advised that in his opinion, GOSSER alone, was responsiblility for the Kaiser Jeep Corporation remaining in Toledo inasmuch as the company had talked of moving from Toledo and GOSSER induced management to remain in Toledo. He said he felt that many Toledo industrialists would support GOSSER. He stated GOSSER had a reputation as an honest and fair man. He stated he knew of no dishonest activities on the part of GOSSER and

said that any rumors to the contrary are purely rumors and have no basis in fact.

BROGAN said he is aware of the rumor that wide-spread gambling took place in the factories of the Kaiser Jeep Corporation and said that GOSSER would not have approved of such activities and he knew that GOSSER did not befiefit from the gambling activities either directly or indirectly. He said he was sure that GOSSER would never give anyone approval to gamble or write numbers at Kaiser Jeep.

BROGAN said he would wholeheartedly recommend RICHARD GOSSER as an honest, responsible and active citizen.

Father JEROME SCHMIT, Catholic Youth Organization, 1601 Jefferson, Toledo, Ohio, advised SA ROBERT W. BURKETT on April 29, 1969, that he has known RICHARD GOSSER since high school days and has known him all these years as a very good man. He said GOSSER has been an active labor leader for many years who was recently convicted in federal court and spent a year in the Springfield, Missouri, federal hospital from which he was paroled. He said GOSSER was active in forming the children's summer camp, the Toledo Retiree Center and pension plans for union workers. He noted GOSSER was in complete control of the union movement in Toledo. He said that GOSSER has kidney trouble and the union purchased a kidney machine for him. noted GOSSER was a man of his word. He noted that GOSSER and his union have been active in Catholic activities. He said Mrs. GOSSER was a very nice woman. j He noted he has visited him in Toledo and also at his home in Florida. He noted GOSSER practices his religion and he would have no doubt as to the good character of GOSSER. He said he considers GOSSER to have an excellent reputation and added he knew of no derogatory information at all concerning him.

1969, he has known the GOSSER family for about 20 years and knows them as good neighbors. He said he would consider GOSSER's reputation to be good and not ed GOSSER associates quite a bit with Catholic priests. He advised he knew of ARNOLD SHENOFSKY, another neighbor of his as being employed as a bodyguard to GOSSER. He noted GOSSER used bad language and profanity and was not a polished individual. He said he had heard rumors concerning GOSSER but said he did not care to repeat them.

NEIGHBORHOOD

presently residing at a subject of advised on May 1, 1969, that she presently is employed at the Toledo Health and Retiree Center, which was founded by GOSSER. She said she lived next door to him for about five years and has known him about twenty years as a social acquaintance. She said they have visited each other with their families and she has worked for him at the Retiree Center. GOSSER, she said, would never hurt anyone intentionally. She said she considers him as extremely honest and as a person who associates with priests, judges, county commissioners and with elderly people. She said she did not know of any bad associates of his and noted he has been helpful to members of the working class.

Mrs.

1969, she has been a neighbor of GOSSER for about five years.

She said he is a nice neighbor whom she only knew as a speaking acquaintance. She noted "he had a good wife who stood by him when he got into that trouble, whatever that was".

She added he had done much for the union and in spite of his trouble with the law, he still had a good reputation. She noted he is on very good terms with many priests, having started a children's summer camp, the Estiree Center and being active in the Church. She said she would like to see him come back as a neighbor noting he no longer lives in Toledo.

EMPLOYMENT VERIFICATION AND REFERENCE

CHARLES BALLARD, President, Toledo Health and Retiree Center, 310 W. Woodruff, Toledo, Ohio, advised on April 30, 1969, that he has known RICHARD GOSSER since 1937 and considers his character and loyalty to be without question. BALLARD knows GOSSER to be a personable individual, though he is a tough and hard bargainer. According to BALLARD, GOSSER has proven to be a very capable leader and has concerned himself both with rank and file and management, and as a result is very conscientious of the community as a whole. For example BALLARD indicated GOSSER's involvement in founding the Health Center, establishing a summer camp and being associated with various civic committees. Mr. BALLARD added that just to indicate what the people think of GOSSER, a chapel has been dedicated to his honor at the Children's Summer Camp at Sand Lake, Michigan.

Mr. BALLARD stated RICHARD GGSSER's moral character

is above reproach and that his associates are all outstanding individuals of the community. BALLARD knew of no involvement with the police or any derogatory information other than when GOSSER was involved in an auto theft back in the 1920's which he received one year in a reformatory.

Mr. BALLARD added that RICHARD GOSSER was one of the founders of the Health Center and has been a consultant since 1955. However, from 1955 until 1964 GOSSER did not receive any pay because at that time he was international vice president for the United Auto Workers. BALLARD then said that in 1964 GOSSER became a member of the public board that runs the Health Center and was then given a salary of \$30,000.00 per year as a consultant.

Mr. BALLARD stated that from 1947 to 1964 GOSSER spent most of his time in Detroit, Mibhigan, where he was associated with the United Auto Workers. From 1942 to 1947, GOSSER was regional director of the Auto Workers, Region 2B, Northwest Ohio, with the office located at 425 Winthrop, Toledo, Ohio. BALLARD added that from 1939 to 1942, GOSSER was the president of United Auto Workers Local #12 in Toledo, and prior to that was the shop chairman at the old Willis Overland Plant in Toledo.

Mr. BALLARD summed things up by saying he knows RICHARD GOSSER to be a very responsible individual whose honesty, integrity and reputation is of the highest caliber. As a matter of fact, added BRALARD, that if GOSSER gave his word, it was as good as a contract.

VIRGIL A. GLADIEUX President, Ogden Foods Corporation, 2140 Ashland, Toledo, Ohio, stated on May 1, 1969, he has known RICHARD T. GOSSER since the early 1930's. GLADIEUX said he has seen GOSSER rise from a rank and file member of the United Auto Workers to regional president then to international Vice President and a member of the National United Auto Workers Board.

GLADIEUX added he has dealt with GOSSER on the business level as well as socially and knows him to be an independent and just person who always illustrated the highest leadership qualifications.

Mr. GLADIEUX stated prior to 1959 GOSSER was primarily

concerned with the rank and file members of United Auto Workers, but for the last ten years he has become involved in helping the community as a whole by attempting to save jobs and workers for the Toledo area and becoming involved in various community affairs. GLADIEUX labeled GOSSER as a practical person who stood up; for what he believed. GLADIEUX advised GOSSER was the type of man that pursued what he thought was right and as a result did many things that were not popular with labor or management.

GLADIEUX stated he knows GOSSER to be annonest and sincere individual and his recommendation for GOSSER would be of the highest order. Further, GLADIEUX advised he had no reason to question GOSSER's character or loyalty, did not know of any derogatory information and knew that GOSSER had a very stable and fruitful family life.

Mr. GLADIEUX finally added that many people do not know RICHARD GOSSER. All they remember is the old union days when things were rought They do not consider the things that illustrate GOSSER's concern for the community, such as the Toledo Health and Retiree Center which was founded by him. This, according to GLADIEUX, is the real RICHARD GOSSER.

Monsignor MICHAEL J. DOYLE, Director, Catholic Charities, Toledo, Ohio, and Chairman, Labor Management Citizens Committee, Toledo, Ohio, advised on May 1, 1969, he has known RICHARD GOSSER for approximately 23 years, both in the arena of Labor-Management relations plus social contacts with committee members. Monsignor DOYLE said that across the table, GOSSER is a real hard bargainer but he is fair and just in dealing with labor and management. The Monsignor added that in 1964 he testified in GOSSER's behalf to the effect that he is a good, substantial and honest citizen in all his undertakings and DOYLE said that he still does not feel or believe that GOSSER was guilty as charged.

Monsignor DOYLE considers RICHARD GOSSER to be an honest person whose character and loyalty were never in question and feels that GOSSER is well respected and highly regarded especially in the labor field. According to DOYLE, Mr. GOSSER is a natural leader as indicated by his life; for example, he inspired the Toledo Health and Retiree Center and rose through the ranks from an electrician to Vice President of the International United Auto Workers under REUTHER. Monsignor added that except for his physical disability GOSSER is a very capable individual.

PROBATION RECORDS

A review of the records of the United States Parole Office of the United States District Court, Toledo, Ohio, on April 4, 1969, reflects the following concerning RICHARD THOMAS GOSSER, commonly known as RICHARD T. GOSSER, former International Vice President of the UAW-CIO, whose residences are shown as 317 West Woodruff, Toledo, and 408 Law Acres Courts, Hollywood, Florida. It was noted that since GOSSER's release on November 23, 1966, he has spent most of his time at his Florida residence. He is known to periodically come to Ohio for physical examination at the Cleveland, Ohio Clinic and for periodic conferences in regard to his present position as a consultant for the Toledo Health and Retiree Center, Toledo, Ohio, where he is currently employed as a consultant.

The record reflects that GOSSER was indicted on November 28, 1962, for conspiracy in that he conspired with others to obtain confidential documents of the Internal Revenue Service in wolation of law. He thereafter

had a jury trial and as a result of this trial a verdict of guilty was sentenced by the United States District Court Judge FRANK L. KEDOEB, United States District Court, Toledo, to a sentence of three years. GOSSER appealed his conviction all the way to the United States Supreme Court, and upon the Supreme Court's denial of hearing, he was transferred to the medical center for federal prisoners at Springfield, Missouri, to serve his sentence on December 5, 1966. He was subsequently paroled on November 23, 1966 and was on parole to the United States Parole Office until November 22, 1968.







Grant of Immunity Under the Communications Act of 1952 - Robert E. Rath

Departmental Attorney Edward T. Joyce has requested authorisation to apply for a grant of immunity to Robert E. Rath who will be called before a session of the Federal Grand Jury in Tolede, Ohio set for the first week of March, 1968, in connection with suspected violations of 18 U.S.C. \$1951, 18 U.S.C. \$371, 29 U.S.C. \$186, and 26 U.S.C. \$7201, by Richard T. Gosser, retired Senior International Vice-President, United Auto Workers, AFL-CIO, and certain officials, once commected with Kaiser Jeep Corporation (formerly Willys Motors, Incorporated), Edwin G. McCleary, Cruse Moss, and Leo McKay.

Robert E. Rath (no FBI number) admitted during eross-examination at his recent trial for income tax evasion that while he was a supplier of non-production items (i.e. paint, paper towels) to Willys Motors, Incorporated, he consistently everbilled Willys for material and made payoffs to union leader Richard T. Gosser. These activities were carried on pursuant to a deal allegedly worked out between Gosser and the above-named executives in the Willys management. Rath's demeaner at trial and the lack of cooperation displayed by Rath's attorney in every portion of the former proceedings indicate that he will probably invoke his Fifth Ammendment privilege at subsequent Grand Jury hearings, and refuse to testify. This was confirmed by Rath's negative remarks to a probation officer when he was abked if Assistant United States Attorney John Mattimos could question him concerning the payoff scheme. Mr. Mattimos believes that Rath will invoke his Fifth Ammendment privilege and refuse to testify should he be called before the Grand Jury.

Mr. Rath is presently appealing his conviction on November 7, 1967, for income tax evasion. He was sentenced to serve 5 years. There are no charges pending against him. Mr. Joyce believes that if Robert E. Rath is granted immunity he will testify to the details of his role in the scheme to everbill the Willys Motors Corporation and pay off Gosser. Further he should be able to implicate both Gosser and the Willys executives in a conspiracy to set up this scheme by testifying about phone calls which he made to the principal conspirators. Mr. Mattimos also believes that Rath was present at meetings between the prospective defendants.

Until the decision of the Supreme Court in Kats v. United States, 389 U.S. 347 (1967), immunisation of a man who was appealing his conviction was inadvisable because of the probability that the Sixth Circuit would adopt the reasoning of the District of Columbia Circuit in United States v. Frank, 347 F.2d 486 (D. C. Cir. 1965). In the Frank case a grant of immunity under 47 U.S.C. \$409(2) would vacate the conviction of any defendant who was immunised, and compelled to testify concerning the subject matter of his conviction, while his case was still in the appellate process. However, the Kats decision (footnote 3, p. 349) rejected this reasoning. Immunity under 47 U.S.C. \$409(2) does not relate to prior prosecutions and adjudications of guilt despite the fact that these convictions may be appealed. Immunity statutes protect witnesses only as to future prosecutions. Reins v. United States, 364 U.S. 507, 513 (1960). Since Lats did not construe the immunity to be transactional, but saw it as prohibiting the fruit of the compelled testimony from being used against the witness in any future trial, it would seem that a retrial of an immunised witness would be permissable in the event that an appellate court reversed the original conviction. The only limitation on the government on retrial would be the prohibition against introducing evidence of the compelled testimony or its fruits. In the Rath case, the appeal is not based on the substantiality of the evidence against him at trial, but, rather is directed at alleged irregularities in the Grand Jury which indicted him. In the event that a retrial is necessary, the government will have no need to rely on evidence compelled by a grant of immunity.

Moreover, the government will be able to demonstrate that all of its evidence was obtained independently of Rath's compelled testimony at the upcoming Grand Jury.

The testimony of Robert E. Rath will be important in securing indictments of Gosser and other individuals who participated in the conspiracy and the substantive violations. Moreover, a check of the records indicates no reason why the Department of Justice should hestitate in granting Mr. Joyce's request. Therefore, it is recommended that his request for authorisation to apply for a grant of immunity be granted.

GOSSER was convicted by a jury trial which lasted approximately two weeks and a verdict of guilty was handed down on February 8, 1963. He was sentenced on February 28, 1963 to a term of imprisonment of three years.

Indictment Number

GOSSER's indictment and subsequent legal proceedings are filed in the U.S. District Clerk's Office, Toledo, Ohio, under Criminal Docket No. 62-120. He had been indicted on November 28, 1962.

Nature of Charge

GOSSER was charged with a conspiracy to defraud the United States under the provisions of Title 18, Section 371, of the U.S. Code.

Fines, Costs and Penalties Imposed

There were no fines or costs assessed by the Court and the sentence of three years imprisonment was the only penalty imposed.

Nature of Plea

GOSSER entered a plea of not guilty in the U.S. District Court, Toledo, Ohio, on December 7, 1962, to the charge of violation of Title 18, Section 371, U.S. Code.

Summary of Facts

The indictment charged a conspiracy from October 12, 1962 to November 12, 1962 to defraud the United States in the administration of the Internal Revenue laws. Co-conspirators were DONALD PINCIOTTI and TED MAISON. GOSSER was the senior vice president of the United Automobile Workers Union and MAISON was a local gambler who was known to an Internal Revenue Service worker whom he bribed to unlawfully steal and convey confidential Internal Revenue documents to him. PINCIOTTI was the administrative assistant to GOSSER. The purpose of the conspiracy was to obtain from the Internal Revenue files copies of reports of a fraud investigation which was being conducted in regard to GOSSER's returns. All three conspirators were convicted after a two week jury trial on February 8, 1963; all appealed their respective cases; GOSSER's and PINCIOTTI's went to the U.S. Supreme Court.

CV 73-514

Upon his conviction being affirmed, GOSSER was committed to the U.S. Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana, on Movember 22, 1965. He was paroled in November, 1966 and completed his parole period successfully in November, 1968.

RICHARD T. GOSSER

Richard T. Gosser is a vice president and a member of the International Executive Board of the United Automobile, Aircraft and Agricultural Implement Workers of America, AFL-CIO.

It has been reported that Gosser was born December 13, 1898, at Toledo, Ohio. It has also been reported that he was born December 13, 1900, at Toledo, Ohio.

According to information received, Richard Gosser attended the St. Francis De Sales School in Toledo, Ohio, and completed the eighth grade. It was stated that when Gosser was a small boy his father died, and when Gosser was a young man he associated with the hoodlum element in Toledo, Ohio.

It has been reported that Richard Gosser was employed as an electrician at the Willys-Overland Company, Toledo, Ohio, from January 12, 1924, to April 1, 1937, when he left for union business.

Richard Gosser was described as one of the first presidents of Local 12, UAW-CIO. He was reportedly elected international vice president of the UAW-CIO in 1947. It has been alleged that during his association with the UAW-CIO he has continued to be a representative of Local 12, UAW-CIO in Toledo, Ohio. Local 12, UAW-CIO has been described as the second largest local in the UAW and the world next to Ford Local 400. Local 12, UAW-CIO has been reported to embrace various large corporations and many smaller ones in the Ohio district. In 1950 it was alleged that Richard Gosser was in complete control of Local 12, UAW-CIO.

Richard Gosser has been described as ambitious, a lone wolf, absolutely ruthless and to be a known "fixer."

It has been alleged that because of Gosser's underworld connections and business associates and through intimidation and threat of bodily harm, Gosser ruled Local 12, UAW-CIO with an iron hand.

It has been alleged that for a number of years Richard Gosser controlled the numbers racket which reportedly had flourished in all industrial plants in Toledo, Chio. It has also been reported that Gosser received a cut from hoodlums, on all numbers written in Toledo factories. It has been reported in the past that Gosser received kickbacks from union representatives; profits from candy and cigarettes sold in factories and on slot machines operated in union establishments. It was also alleged that Gosser owned and operated twelve slot machines in union headquarters, and that he has collected, at his own personal direction, a flower fund for which no record is maintained.

In 1948, an allegation was made that Gosser controlled a newspaper numbers racket and prostitution in Toledo. It has been stated that did Gosser's desk work and

It has been reported that on January 13, 1950, the "Detroit Free Press" indicated that the UAW-CIO had named a top-level committee to investigate land frauds in Toledo against a UAW vice president Richard T. Gosser and four other fellow unionists. The suit allegedly was filed by John A. Bolman, described as a member of Local 12, UAW. Allegedly the suit charged that the five, by manipulation through the Automotive Workers Building Corporation, which Gosser headed, had purchased a hunting and fishing reserve in Clare County, Michigan, and that a profit of \$21,000 was realized through the transaction at the expense of the Union membership.

It has been alleged that one Edward Duck, who was described as a former member of Gosser's staff, headed a drive to collect money for a cooperative store the union intended to open in Toledo. Allegedly all staff members had to contribute not less than \$25 or seek new employment.

In 1949 it was alleged that the books of Local 12 had been falsified and the Gosser attempted to place the blame for the falsification on was described as the falsification of Local 12 and reportedly under Gosser's domination. It was subsequently reported that was aware that Gosser had been thriving on union funds and receiving kickbacks.

It has been reported that Richard Gosser and "Colonial Hardware and Sports at 1854 West Central Avenue. Toledo, Ohio. Goods Store" of Local 12, UAW-CIO, Toledo, Ohio. Allegations have been made that members of Gosser's union have complained because supplies and equipment were purchased through the "Colonial Hardware Store"; also that some of the equipment purchased was not new. It has been alleged that the January 12, 1950, issue of the "Daily Worker" under the by line of William Allan, who was described as the "Daily Worker" representative in Detroit, made reference to a divorce petition filed by Gosser's wife which stated that in addition to a salary from the Union Gosser drew \$10,000 a year from his ownership of the "Colonial Hardware and Sporting Goods Store," Toledo, and payments from dealings with labor and employers. It has also been alleged that for "Colonial Hardware". was also alleged to be a UAW attorney.

It has also been reported that Gosser received profits from the Janis Press, allegedly secretly owned in part by Gosser and profits through manipulation of funds involving the UAW's summer camp.

In 1942 it was alleged that certain individuals in Local 12, Toledo, Ohio, were acquiring sums of money secretly from workers who desired positions in certain national defense plants in Toledo. Specifically, it was alleged that in the Willys-Overland Company many skilled workers had applied for positions in this company but were not permitted to work there inasmuch as they were members of other locals or, in isolated cases, were members refused to pay to Gosser a certain "initiation fee." Indications were received that "initiation fees" as high as \$50 per person were required by Gosser before beginning work in one of the plants which were under contract by Local 12.

It has been reported that Docket No. 29444 in the files of the Lucas County, Ohio, Clerk of Courts reflects Richard Gosser filed for divorce from his wife, Ruth, on January 19, 1949. It was reported that the file relating to the above had been removed from the Court House files and its location was unknown. It was further alleged that on February 14, 1949, Ruth Gosser filed a cross petition for divorce which was granted to her on March 18, 1949. According to information received, Gosser's wife obtained the divorce on the grounds of extreme cruelty.

It has been reported that the property of the "Toledo Blade" caused a private investigation to be conducted on Gosser in 1949.

Information has been received reflecting that in the past Gosser has paid fines and penalties as a result of his failure to report in his income tax returns outside income from the "Colonial Hardware Store" at Toledo, Ohio.

Arrested March 21, 1920, as Richard McMullen as a fugitive from justice and wanted in Monroe County for burglary. Disposition unknown.

Arrested as Richard Thomas Gosser July 2, 1920, on a charge of suspicion of auto theft; released July 6, 1920.

Arrested as Richard Gosser August 16, 1920, on charge of suspicious person. Disposition - thirty days and costs; days suspended on payment of costs on August 18, 1920.

Arrested March 18, 1921, and held to Grand Jury on charge of receiving and concealing stolen property. Indictment No. 12477 for receiving and concealing stolen property was filed March 30, 1921. Indictment No. 12477 was "nollied" on October 14, 1925.

Arrested as Richard Gosser May 1, 1921, as a fugitive from justice - wanted at Monroe, Michigan, for holdup and robbery. Gosser was turned over to Monroe, Michigan, authorities and pleaded guilty on June 6, 1921. He was sentenced to the Michigan Reformatory, Ionia, Michigan, to serve a term of $2\frac{1}{2}$ -15 years.

Richard Thomas Gosser was received at the Michigan State Reformatory, Ionia, Michigan, from Monroe County on June 16, 1921, on a charge of highway robbery and under sentence of 2½-15 years.

On December 7, 1923, first parole was granted for one year; not to leave the State.

On January 10, 1925, Gosser was "discharged."

On November 19, 1939, arrested as Richard Gosser by State Police, Erie Michigan, on a charge of disorderly person. Disposition was listed as \$8.69 costs or ten dayspaid out.

It has also been reported that when Richard Gosser, Toledo, Ohio, Police Department No. 10067, was arrested on May 1, 1921, he was arrested along with Lee Wigley, Tony Patel, Jake Case, Stacey Roberts and James Kennedy. According to the

information received, all of the above-mentioned individuals were at that time charged with being fugitives from justice in that they held up and robbed and three other individuals (names not given) in a touring car on the Dixie Highway near Erie, Michigan. It was further alleged that Leek Wigley, Tony Paul, Jake Case, Stacey Roberts and James Kennedy have arrest records at the Toledo, Ohio, Police Department.

has been reported to have associated with racketeers in and around Toledo, Ohio, for years.

has been reported to have been as and allegedly was incarcerated at the United States Public Health Farm at Lexington, Kentucky, in 1949. According to information received in 1950, was at that time employed as a in gambling houses operated by the brothers and Tony Paul*in Lucas County, Toledo, Ohio.

In the past Gosser has been reported to have a powerful influence in the Toledo, Ohio, Police Department.

Gosser's last reported address was 3476 Drummond Road, Toledo, Ohio.

During an official investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Richard T. Gosser was interviewed by FBI Agents. During the interview he admitted association as a young man with the also admitted association with Tony Paul and the hoodlum element in Toledo, Ohio. He admitted a former sentence of twenty months in a reformatory. He denied ever having a bodyguard in Toledo and stated he only used bodyguards at conventions. He also admitted knowing

stated that gambling did go on in Toledo plants but he alleged that he had made an effort to stop the gambling. He stated that allegations that he was tied in with the gamblers in Toledo were ridiculous.
